

FOREST SUPERVISOR'S ORDER

Pursuant to 36 Code of Federal Regulations 261.50, the following acts are prohibited within the area on or administered by the Clearwater National Forest. These restrictions are in addition to those enumerated in Subpart A, Part 261, Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations and will remain in effect until rescinded.

AREA RESTRICTION

NAME OF AREA: Bungalow
RANGER DISTRICT: North Fork
RESTRICTED PERIOD: Yearlong
AREA DESCRIPTION: SW ¼, Section 18, T38N, R8E (See attached map)

PROHIBITED USE:

All motorized vehicles are prohibited within the restricted area except on roads and trails identified below or designated with appropriate markers (36 CFR 261.54a and 261.55b).

Motorized travel off designated routes is permitted under certain conditions for parking or to access campsites within 200 feet of the designated route.

- Travel to the campsite or parking area must be via a single direct route, selected to produce minimum impact, and utilizing a suitable existing route if present.
- Selection of campsites and parking areas must be by non-motorized means.
- Travel is for the primary purpose of camping or parking, not repetitive riding.
- Suitable routes must avoid steep slopes, riparian areas, streams and wet areas subject to rutting.

DESIGNATED TRAVEL ROUTES:

Roads 247, 250, 250B & 250F

Trails 17 & 144

Refer to the current edition of the Travel Guide for specific restrictions on these designated travel routes.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e), the following are exempt from this restriction:


1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

The above restrictions are necessary for the protection of water quality, vegetation, soil & wildlife.
