


Boise National Forest Emmett Ranger District East Side Travel Map



WHY IS THIS ROAD, TRAIL OR AREA CLOSED?

There are a number of reasons some mode of travel are restricted within National Forests. These are not always understood, particularly if encountered unexpectedly. Here are some of the reasons for them.

● Wildlife Protection

Many closures are intended to protect critical habitat or minimize harassment of wildlife. These areas include big game calving grounds, hunting season security areas, and winter range. Areas closed to motor vehicle use offer quality walk-in or horseback hunting opportunities. Many of these areas are open to vehicle use when wildlife is less likely to be disturbed. The Idaho Department of Fish & Game is a cooperater of closure enforcement.

● Water Quality and Erosion Control

Some roads are closed during wet weather to prevent road and trail surface damage. This closure helps to reduce the erosion and amount of sediment that may enter the streams. Sediment is a serious threat to spawning and rearing areas for steelhead, salmon, and other fish. Additionally, road maintenance costs are reduced through these types of closures.

● Public Safety

In some specific instances, certain types of travel are prohibited to insure user safety. Visitors should always use caution when on forest routes, many receive heavy traffic, are dusty at times, and can be winding and narrow.

● Conflict of Use

In a few cases, it has become necessary to give preference to one use over another to resolve problems that exist among competing user groups, insuring, of course, that adequate opportunity exists elsewhere for the use that has been prohibited.

● Legal Mandates

Areas such as wilderness are afforded special protection by Federal Law. It is unlawful to have possession of and operate any motorized equipment within a classified wilderness area (36 CFR 261.16, 293.17, and 261.19 USC 551).

OFF-ROAD AND OFF-TRAIL MOTORIZED TRAVEL

Area **C** as identified on this map, is closed to all off-road and off-trail motorized travel, except snowmobiles.

Area **D** as identified on this map, is closed to all off-road and off-trail motorized travel.

Most of the area on the east side of the Emmett Ranger District is identified as **E** on this map. This area is open to all off-road and off-trail travel. Because of resource concerns the Forest Service discourages off-trail and off-road use.

In many areas, you will see the remains of old roadbeds that are not signed or displayed on this map. These old roadbeds are the result of old railroad beds, past mining and logging activities, past road obliterations, etc., and are no longer part of the National Forest developed transportation system. These old roadbeds are being restored with vegetative cover and are now managed as part of the general land area. Therefore, all travel along these old roadbeds must comply with the Area Travel Regulations.

EXCEPTIONS

Where dispersed camping and firewood gathering is allowed and off-road and off-trail motorized travel is prohibited, direct access to temporary campsites and for hauling of firewood is permitted, provided that all motorized travel is within 300 feet of a road or within 100 feet of a trail identified as acceptable for motorized travel. Please select your routes carefully, trying to avoid damage to the land, vegetation, or streams.

Temporary exceptions are also authorized for any Federal, State, or local officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty, and for any use that is expressly authorized by the Forest Service under a permit, lease, or contract.

Where qualified, disabled persons may apply for a permit that allows motorized use where motorized use is presently restricted. Please contact the Emmett Ranger District office for further details.

SILVER CREEK SPECIAL CLOSURE

Closed to motorized vehicle use off roads and trails from November 1, through June 1 (with the exception of winter recreational use, e.g. snowmobiles), until further notice.

ROADS, TRAILS, and AREAS ORDER

PROHIBITIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the roads, trails, and areas described in this order, within the administrative boundaries of the Emmett Ranger District, Boise National Forest until further notice.

- Using any type of vehicle on National Forest System roads in violation of restrictions specified on the Emmett Ranger District Travel Map. 36 CFR 261.54(a)
- Using any type of vehicle on National Forest System trails in violation of restrictions specified on the Emmett Ranger District Travel Map. 36 CFR 261.55(b)
- Possessing or using a vehicle off National Forest System roads in violation of restrictions specified on the Emmett Ranger District Travel Map. 36 CFR 261.56

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(c), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- Persons with a permit specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
- Any Federal, State, or local law enforcement officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- Federal or State administrative personnel in the performance of an official duty.

ROADS, TRAILS AND AREAS DESCRIBED:

All National Forest System roads, National Forest System trails, and areas described as open, restricted, or closed on the Emmett Ranger District Travel Map, on National Forest System lands within the administrative boundaries of the Emmett Ranger District, Boise National Forest, within Boise County, Valley County, and Gem County, Idaho.

Use may be temporarily restricted or closed on some roads or trails depending on the seasonal conditions for resource protection and/or public safety. These temporary closures will be posted on the ground until such time that the roads or trails are determined to be suitable for travel, and the closure signs and/or barricades have been removed from the travel way by Forest Officers.

PURPOSE:

To provide for safe motorized travel, protect natural resources (physical and biological), separate recreation opportunities (motorized and non-motorized) and to minimize user conflicts.

IMPLEMENTATION:

- This Order will be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until further notice.
- A map identifying the restrictions on roads, trails, and areas is attached and made part of this Order. Any revisions to this map that are identified in an official errata sheet issued by the Boise National Forest will become part of this Order.
- Any violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b)(6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b)(7)].
- This Order supersedes any previous orders prohibiting the same or similar acts in or on the above-described roads, trails, and areas.



Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with this Travel Map for the areas you may wish to visit. We invite you to visit the District Office and discuss this map or any other aspect of the National Forest that interests you.

ROAD CONDITIONS

Caution should be used when traveling on National Forest System roads. Road conditions can change at any moment causing unsafe travel. Severe storms may cause roads to wash or slump without warning. Always watch for wildlife and livestock on or near roadways; be prepared to stop! Be aware that logging trucks, road maintenance machinery, and other forest users may be traveling the same roads. Always pack survival gear, water, extra clothes, sleeping bags, and food. Traveling within the National Forest can be an enjoyable experience. **PLEASE BE CAREFUL!**

OFF-ROAD VEHICLE (ORV) GUIDELINES

- Stay on existing roadways and trails.
- Do not harass wildlife or livestock.
- Know ORV laws for the area you ride.
- Respect the rights of others. Responsible shared use goes a long way towards keeping our land open.
- Leave all gates as you found them.
- Keep vehicles out of meadows and streams.
- It is illegal in Idaho to operate an ORV while under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Carry tools, lots of water, and a first aid kit as a minimum.
- Inspect your ORV before every ride...it can be a long walk home.
- Avoid riding alone. It is hard to ride with a broken arm.
- Always supervise children on ORV's, and remember, a campground is for camping...not riding!
- Always wear a helmet, eye protection, protective clothing, and boots.

Get permission from the landowner before entering private land.
