CARIBOU-TARGHEE NATIONAL FOREST OFFICIALS ADVISE VISITORS FOR MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND

Springtime on National Forests brings spectacular wildflowers, scenic drives, camping and long hikes. Before traveling to the forest, Caribou-Targhee National Forest Officials remind visitors to keep in mind the following information.

Campgrounds – Campground reservation can be made by calling the toll-free number 1-877-444-6777, or by visiting www.reserveusa.com. This provides an easy and convenient way to ensure that a campsite is available.

- **Dubois Ranger District** - Stoddard Creek will be opened for Memorial Day Weekend. Steel Creek will not be opened until the middle of June, tentatively. Roads are muddy and wet; officials would rather the public stayed off the roads until they dry out to prevent ruts and erosion problems.
- **Ashton/Island Park Ranger District** – All campgrounds will be open for Memorial Day weekend, weather permitting. Warm River Campground is now open with a host in attendance.

- **Teton-Basin Ranger District** - Campgrounds on the district will be open for Memorial Day, weather permitting.
- **Montpelier Ranger District** – Campgrounds opened for Memorial Day Weekend are - St. Charles, Paris Springs, Montpelier Canyon, Willow Flat and Albert Moser. Traditional opening dates for Emigration and Summit View campgrounds will be opened Memorial Day Weekend with no water and half price fees.
- **Palisades Ranger District** – All campgrounds will be opened before Memorial Day.
- **Soda Springs Ranger District** - Most campgrounds are accessible, and there is no charge for the campgrounds but there is also no water provided.
- **Westside Ranger District** – All campgrounds will be opened.

Campfires - When building campfires, visitors are urged to use extreme caution. Campfires should never be left unattended and should be completely extinguished or “Cool to the touch” before leaving the site.

Road Conditions –Weather is always a factor with road conditions. Visitors are urged to use caution when traveling, especially during inclement weather. Travel on wet and muddy roads creates safety hazards and damages fragile soils. Visitors should contact local Forest Service offices to obtain current road information, including off-highway vehicle opportunities and travel maps.

Users are advised to travel only on those routes marked open on a travel map. Questions regarding motorized vehicle use on specific roads or trails should be directed to a local Forest Service office.

Safety –Make sure someone knows where you are going and when you will return. Be prepared for inclement weather by taking the proper clothing and equipment.

Leave No Trace – Practicing Leave No Trace principals minimize the impact to National Forests. For more Leave No Trace information, visit www.lnt.org. These principals include:
