Note:

Open water sources are easily contaminated by human or animal waste. Water from springs, lakes, ponds, and streams should be properly treated before drinking. One recommended method of treatment is to bring clear water to a rolling boil for five minutes.

Trail Description

Escape to Butte Bar for a peaceful getaway. This remote hike through the forest is lavishly lined with dogwoods and ferns. A mile from the trailhead is the Pacific Crest Trail (PCT). You will continue on the PCT for a half-mile before splitting off to Butte Bar. At the base, Butte Bar offers good camping areas dotted along the Middle Fork of the Feather River with a series of moderately deep swimming holes. As a note of warning, the trailhead is located at the end of a very brushy roadway. Take your time traveling down this road. There is no avoiding the scratching brush, so take an appropriate vehicle. *(The trail is generally open from mid-June to mid-October, snow and road conditions permitting.)*
