

ACCESS: Fallsview Campground is located 3.5 miles south of Quilcene on U.S. Highway 101. Campground is on right side of road.



pulling trailers or motorhomes. This road leads to Mt. Walker summit which is 2,835 feet. There are excellent views of Puget Sound, Seattle, Mt. Rainier, Mt. Baker, Mt. Buckhorn, Mt. Jupiter, and Mt. Constance on a clear day. Even on clearer days you may be able to see the Space Needle or Mt. Helens. Nearby, Hood Canal and Quilcene Bay are known for their oysters and clam beds. Swimming, boating and waterskiing are available nearby. Many hikes are within _ to one-hour drive from Fallsview Campground.


FEE: Regular \$10.00 camping fee will cover two licensed passenger vehicles and a maximum of eight persons. **The two vehicle rule may consist of any combination of the following:** *Two passenger cars, trucks, and/or recreation vehicles (NOTE: boat trailers and recreation trailers are not considered passenger vehicles).*

FACILITIES: Two separate camping loops will accommodate different types of camping vehicles. The right loop offers 14 trailer/RV sites, including six pull through sites for larger RV's. Some will accept trailers or motorhomes up to 35 feet. No hookups are provided. The left loop has 16 camper/tent sites. Water, restrooms and garbage cans are available in each loop. Table and firepits are available at each campsite. A picnic area with four tables is located in the left loop near the waterfall.

An additional \$5.00 fee is charged for each passenger vehicle over the two-vehicle rule. The 8-person maximum capacity per campsite still applies.

SETTING: Forest of conifers and rhododendrons. Located high above the Big Quilcene River. A short scenic loop trail offers visitors a view of a cascading waterfall one hundred feet into the Big Quilcene River.

The narrow falls cascade 100 feet to the Big Quilcene River.



OPPORTUNITIES: Camping, hiking, scenery, fishing and picnicking. Other opportunities in the area include Mt. Walker Viewpoint located 1.5 miles south of the

PASS REQUIRED: *A NW Forest Pass or a Golden Passport (Eagle, Age or Access) is required on each vehicle parked at most trailheads. Day & Annual Passes are available at FS offices and vendors, but not at trailheads.*
