HFRA Scoping

The Ninemile Project was re-scoped with a letter sent out on January 27, 2004. The HFRA scoping was published in the Herald and News newspaper legal notices on January 30, 2004. All of the people, agencies, and organizations contacted previously were sent the HFRA scoping letter. In the letter Ranger Ragan stated that “The Ninemile Fuels Reduction Project is being rescoped under the new Healthy Forest Restoration Act provisions. Even if you replied to the original Ninemile scoping in May 2002, you must submit comments in the next thirty days for your concerns to be heard on the Ninemile Project. Comments and concerns about the Ninemile Fuels Reduction Project must be submitted in written form.”
