Quarterly Schedule of Proposed Actions July-September 2003

PURPOSE OF THE NEPA QUARTERLY

This schedule lists actions being proposed on the Forest that are governed by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). The purpose of this schedule is to provide early and informal notice of proposed projects so that you can become aware of Forest Service activities, indicate your interest in specific projects, and become involved early in the environmental analysis and documentation process.

FORMAT

Proposed actions (projects) are sorted by the Ranger District where the action would occur. In some cases, Forest-wide projects are listed separately. Information indicating what stage of public involvement and analysis is occurring is provided for each proposal. Following the proposals is a list of decisions made since the last quarterly schedule. With this information, you'll have an idea of upcoming projects, and you may wish to get involved by commenting on them. We're still analyzing some projects listed in the last Quarterly schedule, so they appear once again in this update. In future months, we'll add new projects as they are proposed, and they will be listed in future issues of the NEPA Quarterly.

The information given for each project is brief, but specific. A table provides the project name, short description, location, time frames for public involvement, a date when we expect to make a final decision on the projects, a contact person, and the status of the analysis. Each project has a unique alphanumeric number that is keyed to a map showing the general project location on a particular District. From time to time other information associated with environmental analysis or planning will also be included in the NEPA Quarterly.

HOW YOU CAN BECOME INVOLVED

Read through the list of proposed projects. If you want to comment on a project or be placed on the project mailing list, call the contact person or write to the appropriate office (see list of offices on the next page). You may comment right then, or ask to be put on a mailing list for that specific project to receive more information and an opportunity to comment at a later time. We ask you be project-specific about your interest.

ROLE OF THE NEPA QUARTERLY

The NEPA Quarterly adds to the public involvement activities we have always done; it doesn't replace them. We will continue to contact those people known to be affected by and/or interested in our proposals. Those that have expressed interest about certain projects will still be contacted.

Thank you for reviewing this list of recent decisions and proposed projects. We appreciate your interest in the management of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest.

PRIVACY OF YOUR COMMENTS

Comments received in response to solicitation as part of the NEPA process, including names and addresses of those who comment, will be considered part of the public record on a proposed action, and will be available for public inspection. Comments submitted anonymously will be accepted and considered; however, those who submit anonymous comments will not have standing to appeal the subsequent decision under 36 CFR Parts 215 or 217. Additionally, pursuant to 7 CFR 1.27(d), any person may request the agency to withhold a submission from the public record by showing how the Freedom of Information Act permits such confidentiality.

ANTICIPATED "WALK-IN" BUSINESS

Requests from the public occasionally necessitate that analysis be completed with a short turn-around. This may mean that some decisions are made without prior announcement in this update. Examples of walk-in requests include special use roads and utility rights-of-way. Scoping efforts for these requests will be conducted as applicable.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

The following are definitions of some of the terms used in this report.

Appeal Period - The 45-day period after publication of a decision in which an appeal can be filed.

Categorical Exclusion (CE) - A category of actions that do not individually or cumulatively have a significant effect on the human environment. Neither an environmental assessment nor an environmental impact statement is required.

Comment Period - The time allowed for interested persons to provide comments to a Responsible Official on a proposed action.

Decision Memo (DM) - A concise written record of the responsible official's decision to implement an action that has been categorically excluded from documentation.

Decision Notice (DN) - A concise written record of the responsible official's decision based on an environmental assessment and finding of no significant impact.

Environmental Assessment (EA) - A document that presents issues and concerns important to a project, alternate means of accomplishing a project, and environmental effects of each of these alternatives.

Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) - This document is required for proposed actions that may have significant effects on the human environment. The contents are similar to an environmental assessment, and it includes some additional sections.

Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) - A document prepared by a federal agency presenting the reasons why an action, not otherwise excluded, will not have a significant effect on the human environment and for which an environmental impact statement will not be prepared.

NEPA - Acronym for the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. This is the procedural guide for the decision making process for site-specific projects.

Proposed Action - A proposal made by the Forest Service to authorize, recommend, or implement an action on National Forest System lands to meet a specific purpose and need which is subject to public notice comment provisions.

Scoping - Includes internal and public involvement to determine the range of issues to be addressed. Scoping aids in the development of alternatives for a proposed action.

Significance - As used in the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), requires consideration of both context and intensity.

DECISIONS ISSUED SINCE THE LAST NEPA QUARTERLY

FOREST-LEVEL

2003 Road-Stream Crossing Repair & Maintenance (SO21). Four Decision Memos were signed by district rangers to maintain roads as follows: 04/30/2003, Barry Paulson (4 sites); 05/22/2003, Butch Fitzpatrick (4 sites); 05/30/2003, Bob Hennes (3 sites); and 06/05/2003, Joel Skjerven (1 site). These decisions are categorically excluded from the preparation of an EA or EIS, and are not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)4 (1993).

EAGLE RIVER-FLORENCE RANGER DISTRICT

Northwest Howell Environmental Impact Statement (EF30). On 04/14/2003, District Ranger Butch Fitzpatrick decided to implement Northwest Howell FEIS Alternative 2. A 45-day appeal period for this decision concluded on 06/02/2003. One appeal was received. The appeal disposition period ends 07/17/2003.

Hedmark Farm and Riley Creek Prescribed Burns (EF32 AND EF35). On 06/11/2003, District Ranger Butch Fitzpatrick decided to conduct fuel treatments at the Hedmark Farm and Riley Creek sites. A 30-day public comment period ended 06/10/2003. No comments were received. This decision is not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)3 (1993).

Old Growth Studies on the Argonne Experimental Forest (EF34). This proposal has been deferred indefinitely. If funding and personnel become available in the future, it may be re-initiated and listed in this schedule.

GREAT DIVIDE RANGER DISTRICT

Cayuga Environmental Impact Statement (GD02). On 05/07/2003, District Ranger Barry Paulson decided to implement Cayuga FEIS Alternative 5. A 45-day appeal period for this decision concluded on 06/30/2003. One appeal was received. The appeal disposition period ends 08/14/2003.

Rock Lake Mountain Bike Trail Reroute (GD11). On 04/02/2003, District Ranger Barry Paulson decided to reroute the Rock lake bike trail to reduce erosion. No comments were received during the 30-day public comment period. This decision is not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)3 (1993).

FR381 Gravel Pit Expansion (GD29). On 06/20/2003, District Ranger Barry Paulson decided to expand a gravel pit for gravel to maintain FS Road 381. This decision is categorically excluded from the preparation of an EA or EIS, and is not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)4 (1993).

2003-2004 Upland Opening Maintenance (Not previously listed). On 06/25/2003, District Ranger Barry Paulson decided to maintain upland wildlife openings on about 70 acres. This decision is categorically excluded from the preparation of an EA or EIS, and is not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)4 (1993).

FR 336 Mathey Road Clearing and Widening (GD30). This proposal has been deferred indefinitely.

FR1275 Fuel Reduction (GD 31). On 07/22/2003, District Ranger Barry Paulson decided to remove hazard fuels on both sides of Forest Roads 1265 and 1275, to widen the firebreak in response to local concerns. This decision is categorically excluded from the preparation of an EA or EIS, and is not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)4 (1993).

Trailhead Parking Area Reconstruction (MP05). On 04/28/2003, District Ranger Bob Hennes decided to improve parking at two trailheads (Blockhouse Lake and Highway 64). This decision is categorically excluded from the preparation of an EA or EIS, and is not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)4 (1993).

Medford Gypsy Moth Control (MP12). On 05/05/2003, District Ranger Bob Hennes decided to allow the State to aerially apply pheromones in infested areas to disrupt gypsy moth mating. No comments were received during the 30-day public comment period. This decision is not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)3 (1993).

WASHBURN RANGER DISTRICT

Washburn Gypsy Moth Control (WB73). On 04/30/2003, District Ranger Chris Worth decided to allow the State to aerially apply pheromones and biological controls in infested areas to disrupt gypsy moth mating. No comments were received during the 30-day public comment period. This decision is not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)3 (1993).

Binder Site Material (WB62) This proposal has been deferred indefinitely.

Perch & Long Lake Toilet Replacements (WB74). On 06/30/2003, District Ranger Chris Worth decided to replace toilets at two campgrounds. This decision is categorically excluded from the preparation of an EA or EIS, and is not subject to appeal pursuant to 36 CFR 215.8 (a)4 (1993).




