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Proposed Trail Plan – Details*

1. Burnt Hill Alternate Trail – This trail will remove multi-use traffic from the Interloken Trail. The FS has started the preliminary study on this trail.
2. Wardners Corners Relocation – This will relocate a section of the No-Tan-Takto Trail off of Wardners Road. The FS has completed the environmental review of this project and construction will start this summer and continue in fall.
3. Horse Camp Connector – Horse traffic will have access to the Burnt Hill Trail without traveling on Picnic Area Road.
4. Pearsall Loop – this circles around the edges of two existing fields and connects to the north end of the No-Tan-Takto Trail.
5. Vesa Road Trail – This uses an abandoned roadway to provide access to the Forest from the east.
6. Satterly Hill Trail – This trail travels over private lands, connection the Interloken Trail and Satterly Hill.
7. Burnt Hill Trail Spur – This is a short loop for hikers at the Blueberry Patch campground.
8. Terry Berry Road Trail – This will us an abandoned road to provide Forest access from the west.
9. Wildlife Ponds Trail – This uses an existing trail leading to two wildlife ponds and continues to Chicken Coop Road.
10. East Side Trail – This is an alternate multi-use trail heading north and south.
11. Sassafras Pond Trail – This is a short loop to Sassafras Pond using an old trail.
12. Caywood Point Trail – This would be a trail over private lands connecting Caywood point to the rest of the Forest.
