The table below summarizes the management activities that are emphasized by management area. Other management activities may occur, but are not the primary emphasis. Management Areas in bold indicate Management Areas currently used.

1	Small trees for intensive timber production, wildlife game species, motorized recreation
2.1	National Forest land along streams, multiple uses, uneven-aged management
2.2	General Forest, multiple uses, uneven-aged management
2.4	N.F. land along streams, preservation, some wildlife habitat maintenance
2.5	General Forest, high-value selection harvesting
2.8	General Forest, site-specific decisions on management
2.9	Management of small scattered tracts. Due to isolated nature more variables are present than in 2.8
3.1	General Forest, multiple uses, even-aged management, motorized access
3.3	General Forest, multiple uses, even-aged management
3.5	General Forest, multiple uses, mix of uneven-aged and even-aged management
4	Coniferous stands
5.1	Congressionally designated Wilderness Areas
6.1	General Forest, multiple uses, primarily even-aged management, limited access
6.2	General Forest, preservation, limited access, solitude offered in recreation experience
6.4	General Forest, preservation, limited access, minimum management, but wildlife maintenance allowed.
7.1	Developed Recreation Areas
8.1	Research Natural Areas
