



The Ottawa National Forest is involved in many programs and activities. As in the past, this issue of the Ottawa Quarterly is a listing of proposed resource management projects for which we have a specific proposal and are in the process of analyzing as directed by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).



The Forest Service decision-making process provides opportunities for interested parties to give their ideas and opinions about resource management. This input is important in helping us identify resource needs, which will shape the alternatives evaluated and lead to the formation of a decision. There are several points in the planning process during which you can be the most helpful, but exact steps and timing may vary depending on the type and complexity of the project. For example, the whole planning process may only take a few days for small, non-complex projects, or several years for large complex projects. Nevertheless, there are some basic steps we go through for every project. The section titled "The Project Planning Process and How You Can Be Involved" describes these steps and identifies what you can do to be involved. It is important for you to understand this process so that you may receive the environmental documents in which you are interested.

This list is not all-inclusive. Some projects may come up after publication and require our immediate attention. As a result, we may complete the decision document before the next edition.

Furthermore, if you have received previous editions of this list you will notice that some projects do not appear anymore. That is because we have finished the analysis, made the decision and the appeal period (if applicable) has ended; or, in other cases we have removed projects from the list because we were unable to pursue them for various reasons such as a conflict with other forest priorities. If these projects are re-initiated in the future then they will again be added to the Quarterly Report. Please call the person listed as the "contact" for a project anytime you have a question.

Definition of Terms

Scoping – A process to help determine any potential significant issues that may be related to the proposed action and subsequently addressed in the environmental documents.

Notice of Intent (NOI) - A notice that an Environmental Impact Statement will be prepared and considered.

Proposed Action - A site-specific proposal made by the Forest Service to authorize, recommend, or implement an action on National Forest System lands.

Environmental Assessment (EA) - A document which presents issues and concerns important to a project, and alternate means of accomplishing a project, and analysis of potential environmental effects of each of those alternatives. This information is used to help determine whether to prepare an environmental impact statement or a finding of no significant impact.

Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) - A document which presents issues and concerns important to a project, and alternate means of accomplishing a project, and analysis of potential significant environmental effects of each of those alternatives.

Decision Notice (DN) - A written record of the responsible official's decision based on an Environmental Assessment and a finding of no significant impact.

Decision Memo (DM) - A written record of the

responsible official's decision to implement an action that has been categorically excluded from documentation in an environmental impact statement or an environmental assessment.

Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) - A document prepared by a federal agency presenting the reasons why an action will not have a significant effect on the human environment and for which an Environmental Impact Statement will not be prepared.

Record of Decision (ROD) - A written record of the responsible official's decision based on an Environmental Impact Statement.

Appeal - is the written document filed with an Appeal Deciding Officer by one who objects to a decision.

Appeal Period - The 45 calendar-day period following publication of a decision document during which an appeal may be filed.

Management Area (MA) – described in the Forest Plan--an area delineated on a map showing the location where a management prescription applies.

Opportunity Area (OA) - A subunit of a Management Area.

Substantive Comment - Comments that are within the scope of the proposed action, are specific to the proposed action, have a direct relationship to the proposed action and include supporting reasons for the Responsible Official to consider. (36 CFR 215.2)

REMINDER: On June 4, 2003 the US Department of Agriculture Forest Service issued a Final Rule revising the Notice, Comment, and Appeal Procedures for National Forest System Projects and Activities codified at 36 CFR Part 215 (published in the Federal Register). **The rule is now in effect in its entirety.** “The Project Planning Process and How You Can Be Involved” has been updated to reflect changes from the revised regulations. Additional changes to the regulations will be reflected in cover letters and legal notices for future documents produced by the Ottawa. Notable among the changes are the new email addresses for electronic submission of comments and administrative appeals listed below. **Please make note of the new requirements when you receive future documents.**

NOTICE

2004 Recreation Program Changes

Beginning summer 2004, the Ottawa National Forest will close six of our smaller, less frequently used campgrounds on a TRIAL basis. These TRIAL closures are being proposed in an effort to reduce costs associated with maintaining campgrounds that are not cost effective to operate (i.e., costs for maintenance and upkeep exceed fees collected). Those campgrounds affected include: Matchwood, Perch River Wayside, Lower Dam Lake, Taylor Lake, Tepee Lake and Paulding Pond.

During 2004 we will be gathering public comment and input related to these TRIAL closures. The Forest will use comments received from the public to help us determine whether these TRIAL closures will become permanent. In addition to public feedback, the Forest will complete additional internal reviews to determine the cost savings associated with the TRIAL closures and personnel time savings. A decision on the final status of these campgrounds will be made in 2005.
