Appendix D- Proposed Notifications and Stipulations

Stipulations

This section provides a list of the stipulations. The resources and situations requiring stipulations are listed in Table D-1. These stipulations are in addition to the lease terms and standard stipulations (Forest Supplement FSM 2820) and are necessary to protect specific resource values on the lease area. If found to be in the public interest, these stipulations may be made less restrictive, or otherwise modified, when specifically approved in writing by an authorized officer of the Forest Service.

A stipulation is "necessary" if the protection involved exceeds that which is already provided for in the terms of the standard lease or in regulations.

A. No Surface Occupancy Stipulation

No surface occupancy or use is allowed on the lands described below (legal subdivision or other description).

C. Controlled Surface Use Stipulation

To maintain aesthetic values, all semi-permanent and permanent facilities may require painting, camouflage or landscaping to blend with the natural surroundings. The paint selection, method of camouflage, or landscaping requirements will be subject to approval by the authorized officer of the Forest Service.

f. Protection of visual and recreation qualities as discussed in the Wayne Forest Plan (p. ____).

- g. Protection of stream channels, lakes, wetlands, and adjacent floodplains and riparian ecosystems.
- h. Protection of federally-listed proposed endangered or threatened species, regional sensitive species, and Forest species of concern.
- i. Additional intrusions upon the Management Area 6.2 are to be avoided, so that the Desired Future Condition can be eventually provided.
